EISA's WELCOME

Dear Colleagues,

Welcome to Lille for the 17th edition of the Pan-European Conference (PEC) on International Relations!

We are excited to announce PEC2024 programme with 23 standing sections, 32 regular sections, as well as a set of social events and discussion panels, gathering over 1100 participants. This year, and in addition to the much-anticipated opening plenaries (August 28th) and the Grand Reception (August 30th), we will be reflecting on more than 10 years of association's work (August 28th) as well as launching a new version of the Early Career Development Group event programme, with the ECD Hub: L(a)unch and Networking (August 30th) and with a dedicated Early Career Hub Programme.

We are gathered for this year's EISA amid concerning developments in the world and in international politics. Although academia and research might sometimes seem futile in the face of such daunting events, we are here to reflect, this year particularly as the programme chairs are inviting us to, on how we can best support academic freedom and those of us facing institutional and political pressures, but more broadly as academics and on the role of research and teaching.

EISA is committed to creating inclusive and open spaces of discussion and exchange, at the Pan-European Conference and at the European Workshops on International Studies (EWIS) alike. We are supporting our members through various financial resources. For PEC2024, we allocated 50 Mobility Funds and 5 Review of International Political Economy (RIPE) funds amounting 22.000 Euro in total. In addition, EISA Postdoctoral Bridge Grants, launched in 2023, continue to support recently graduated or final-year PhD students to bridge the gap between a doctorate and a postdoctoral funded or salaried position. In 2024, we distributed our first grants as part of our new funding initiative, the EISA Dissertation Fieldwork Support Grants. We are also keen to stay in touch all year long as a community, through online events, through our 'Voices' podcast, and through our book series 'Voices in International Relations'. If you have any other suggestions to keep our community engaged, please share them at our General Assembly on Thursday, August 29th, or contact the Governing Board.

Many of our members and beyond were involved in the organization of this year's PEC. Our deepest gratitude goes in particular to our local host Philippe Bonditti and our wonderful programme chairs Catherine Chinara Charrett and Monique Beerli. The team's effort was supported by the EISA Governing Board and its Executive Committee, as well as our management company C-IN. The programme would not be the same without the ECD Group, supported by Board member Joana Ricarte. Finally, we would like to thank the section chairs for their hard work in bringing together colleagues around thematic, methodological,

ethical, theoretical or pedagogical questions, and all of you for your contributions.

Thank you for being a part of our community. We wish you an excellent PEC2024!

PROGRAMME CHAIRS' WELCOME

Dear friends and colleagues,

Welcome to Lille for the 17th Pan-European Conference on International Relations. Given intense debates over what counts as knowledge about the international, this year's theme "Searching for International Relations: Spaces, Styles, Struggles" invites participants to collectively contemplate disciplinary boundaries and openings. In a year where struggle dominated the international as well as academic spaces, the conference theme is as pertinent as ever.

In times of global upheaval and transformation, International Relations (IR) as a discipline looks upon itself to reflect, respond and adapt. Currently, the liberal international order sees renewed attention and strain. Despite state resistance, South Africa charted important overtures for change from within the International Court of Justice. Resisting the ruinations of capitalism, Congolese have protested extractive corporate practices deeply embedded in today's global technologies and energy industries. In the face of a grave genocide and scholasticide in Palestine as emphasised by United Nations experts, mobilisations around the globe have called for an immediate ceasefire, professing discontent with political inaction. We have witnessed crackdown on protestors and dissenters, including our own students and colleagues, whose jobs, studentships and livelihoods are at risk. Universities are reinvigorated as sites of dissent, community-building and political transformation, whilst being embroiled in disputes over the meaning of academic freedom and scientific responsibility. The current moment thus raises a series of questions: Where is the international being made and unmade? What legacies of power are brought to the fore in these processes? How can our discipline illuminate these vectors?

This conference aims to fashion space for such reflection, in an open, receptive, rigorous and discerning atmosphere. We invite attention to the spaces in which the international is formed, as well as towards those whose labour, sacrifices and efforts forge new trajectories in the international. We interrogate how stylistic conventions enable and limit what can be said and written, and we query how we might, as authors and educators, reach out to non-academic audiences. Through these reflections, we reassess our duties, responsibilities and moral obligations to our students, as well as to society at large. The stances we take as academics may be embedded in and linked to struggles for social justice, within the academy and beyond. This conference thus wishes to enliven constructive dialogue and encourage attention to what emerges as a responsibility of care and an ethics of engagement.

The EISA continues to be a vital site for scholars to come together to ask themselves hard but important questions about IR as a discipline and our epistemic practices. The affordances and opportunities offered by the EISA cannot be done without the volunteer labour of the EISA's incredible board. We would like to recognise all the EISA board members for their efforts to keep the association

churning. We are particularly grateful to Nora El Qadim, Beatrix Campbell and Beste Isleyen who were our key interlocutors. We are also indebted to Tererza Dvořáková for her amazing administrative support, and to Philippe Bonditti for bringing the conference to Lille. We are humbled by all the participants who organised sessions, submitted papers and came to Lille to engage in conversations tied to our thematic agenda. This year we have 23 standing sections and 32 new sections, and 1122 participants from 62 countries, including 301 doctoral students. The conference unites a beautiful diversity of voices from around the world. Yet, as mobility is never evenly distributed, we also extend our sincere regards to those who could not join. We understand these are difficult times for many and we hope the conference will foster community-building, solidarities and healing, with the intention of bringing about wider social change.

LOCAL ORGANISERS' WELCOME

The Université catholique de Lille (UCL), which next year celebrates its 150th anniversary, is delighted to host the 2024 EISA Pan-European Conference from 27 to 31 August 2024.

In choosing the UCL as the venue for its annual conference, the EISA has not only chosen the largest non-profit private university in France, with its 40,000 students, 5 faculties, 345 programmes, more than 20 Schools and institutes and over 700 researchers. The EISA has also chosen a university with humanist values that are reflected in its many commitments to addressing the world's greatest challenges: in terms of climate change and environmental issues by signing the Grenoble Agreement; in the fields of health and social matters through its hospital complex and the creation of a whole new neighbourhood named "Humanicité" around it; by its active role in offering help to refugees and vulnerable persons via its involvement in the Univ'R initiative (UNHCR/AUF) and an information bus to provide legal advice for those who may need it. In all these areas, the UCL aims to be not merely a witness but also player in this changing world by being both deeply rooted locally and open globally.

In addition to its local role, the UCL is also the second largest Erasmus consortium in France and an associate member of EUNICE, a transnational alliance of universities set up in 2020. Today, the UCL has 558 partnerships with foreign universities and many dual degrees in various disciplines (humanities, law, economics, management, ...). A growing number of foreign researchers are welcomed every year by the university and help in return to make it a multilingual and multicultural institution. The UCL is committed to building up its international profile and is in the process of launching a new funding programme to support incoming and outgoing mobility for researchers.

This international involvement is also reflected in our research and teaching. In terms of pedagogy, since 2018, the UCL offers, within its European School of Social and Political Science (ESPOL), the very first 100% IR degree at BA level in France. Every year, some 200 students join this programme and learn how to address the most pressing issues at a world level: conflicts, the environment, migrations, borders and development. With the addition of an ambitious new Bachelor's programme in Politics, Philosophy and Economics launched in autumn 2024, ESPOL students can follow it up with a Master's degree combining theoretical rigour with practical contact with actors in international affairs. Further evidence of the importance of the international dimension within the UCL's course offerings is the large number of programmes (Human rights; Security and development; International business and competition law; European dispute resolution) developed by the Law Faculty (FLD), and the annual 'Global Actors for Peace' Master class that, since 2017, has hosted an ever-increasing number of renowned professionals and researchers from across the world. Finally, the Faculty of Arts and Humanities (FLSH) offers a History/IR Master's degree with three possible pathways: Geopolitics, Security and Defence, and

Development and transition. All these degree programmes offered by the UCL lead to its PhD programme, which welcomes doctoral students from all over the world.

In terms of research, the international dimension constitutes a cross-disciplinary theme shared by several of our faculties, around which various approaches towards international relations combine. Within the FLSH, the MUSE research unit has an 'Emerging Worlds' research axis focussing on new developments in global political, economic and cultural geography. The FLD's C3RD research centre focuses on critical and global approaches to security with particular reference to shifting concepts of security and their legal and normative ramifications. Last but not least, since 2018 ESPOL-Lab has been pursuing multidisciplinary and innovative research on 'Reconfigurations of the International' within which, echoing the theme of EISA PEC 2024, the international dimension is studied both as an object of thought and an empirical reality.

In welcoming the annual conference of the EISA, the UCL is not only pleased to open its doors to researchers from around the world. It also wishes to support the effort that our increasingly complex and rapidly changing world calls for, and warmly welcomes the excellent collaboration between all those concerned who have made this major event in International Relations possible. On behalf of all its members, we wish you all an excellent conference.

ABOUT LILLE

Founded in 1066 by the Count of Flanders, Lille – Rijsel in Flemish – became an important trading and stock market point on the route between the rich Flemish towns and the Champagne fairs. As evident from some of its architecture, Lille was successively Flemish, Burgundian, and Spanish before finally becoming French in 1667 under Louis XIV, whose military engineer, Vauban, built Lille’s impressive Citadel.

Lille’s strategic location and the area’s rich resources have made it one of the most fought over regions in Europe, a history visible today particularly through the numerous memorials from the last two World Wars in the region, toured by national and international visitors each year. Lille can boast all the conveniences of being at the centre of a 2 million inhabitant urban zone, yet remains a “human-sized” university city with 250,000 inhabitants. Visitors can get around easily on foot or by bicycle. Public transport also offers the metro, the tramway, and many buses.

CLIMATE

Lille experiences a temperate climate, with mild summers and cool winters. The spring and autumn months offer pleasant weather, making them ideal for exploring the city.

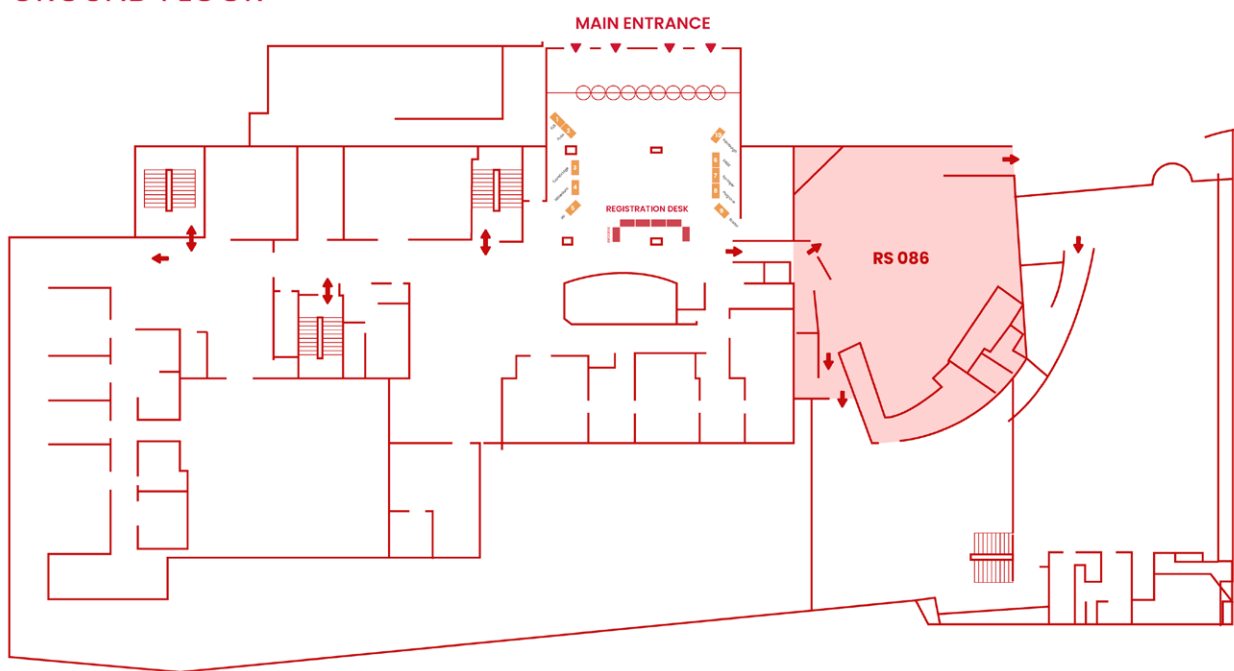

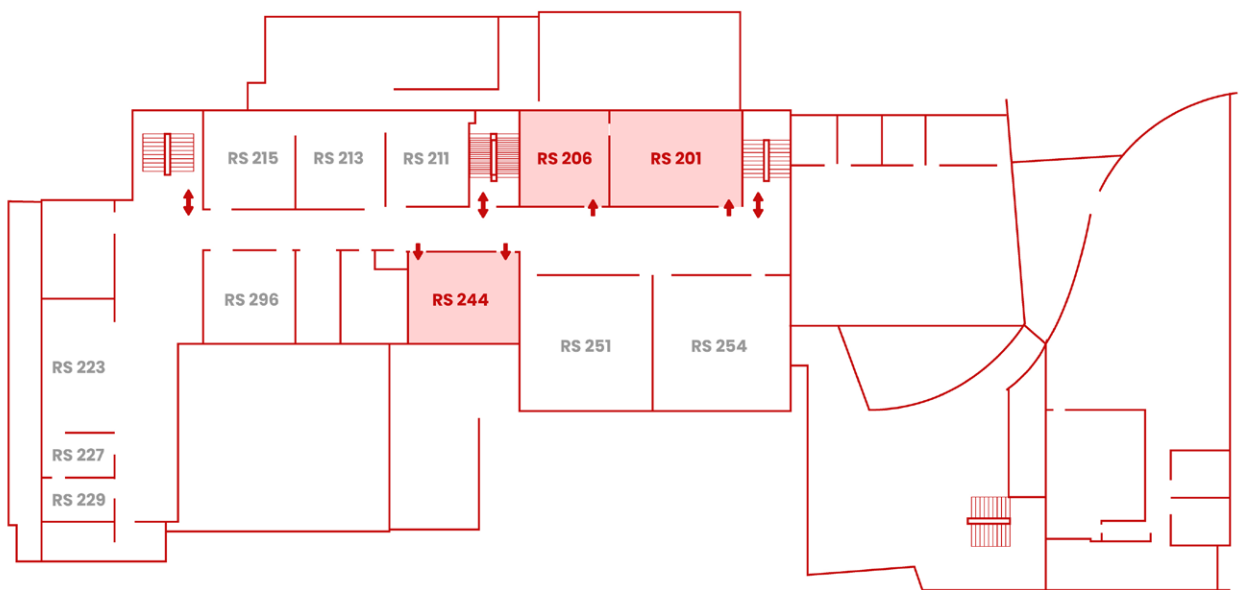

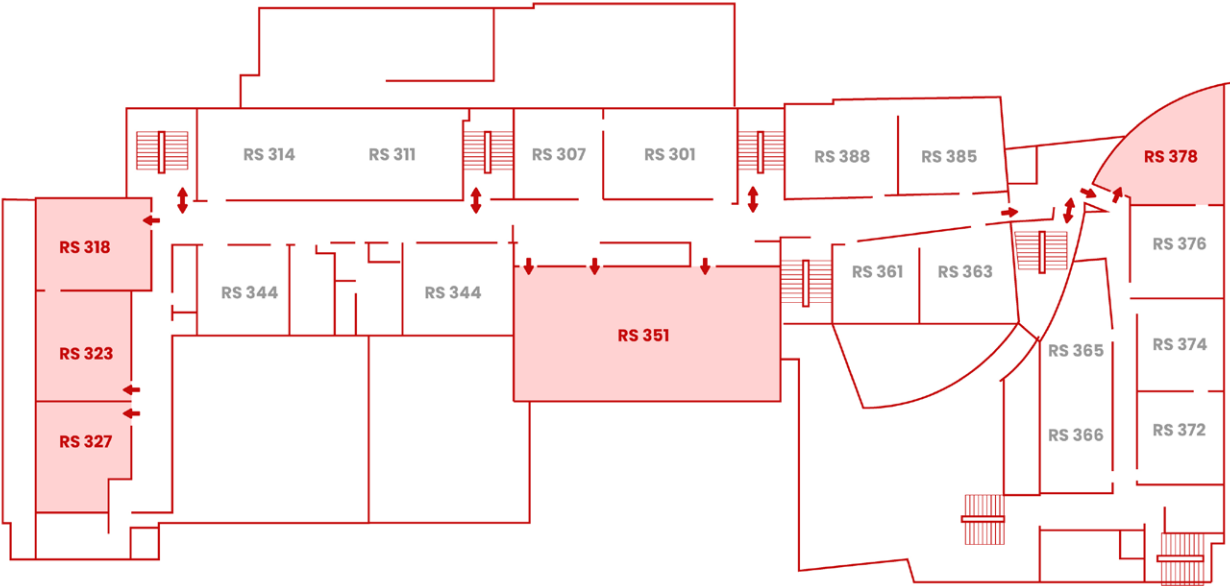

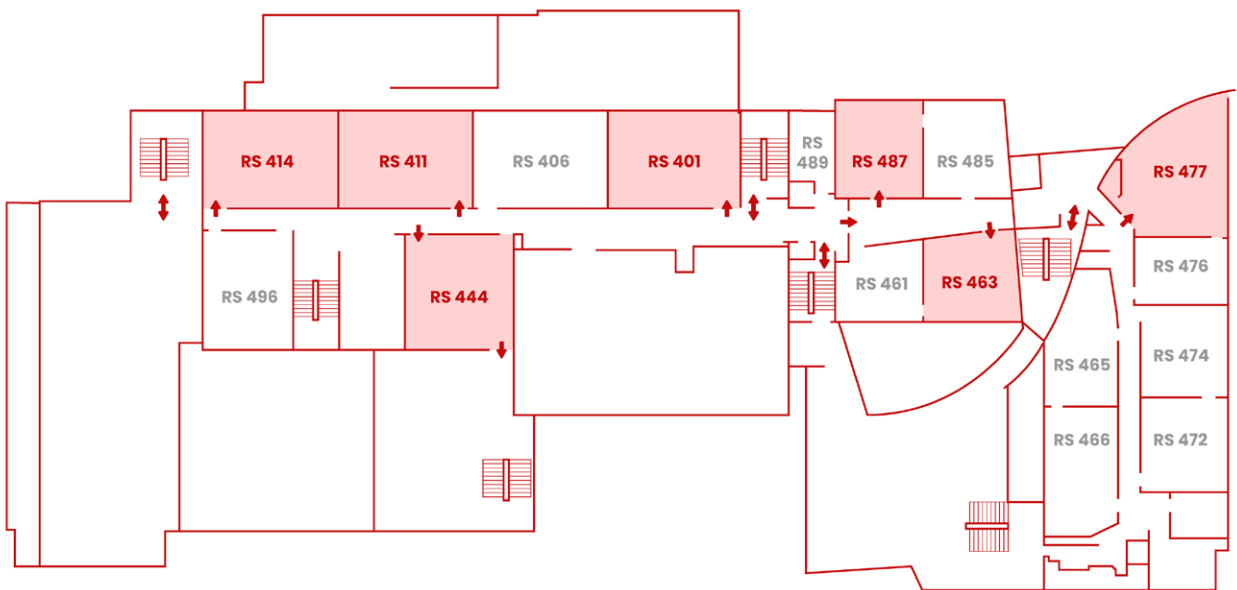

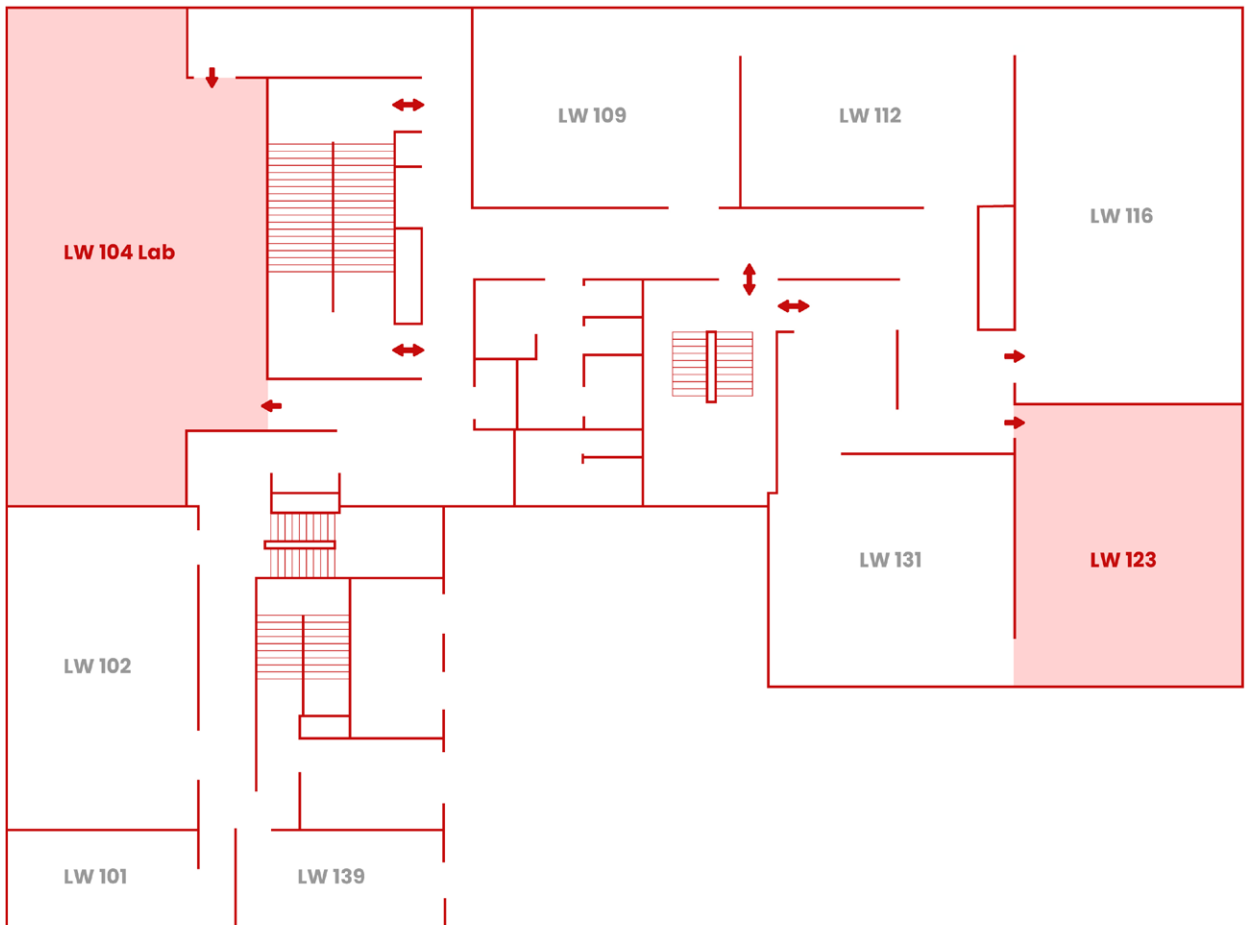

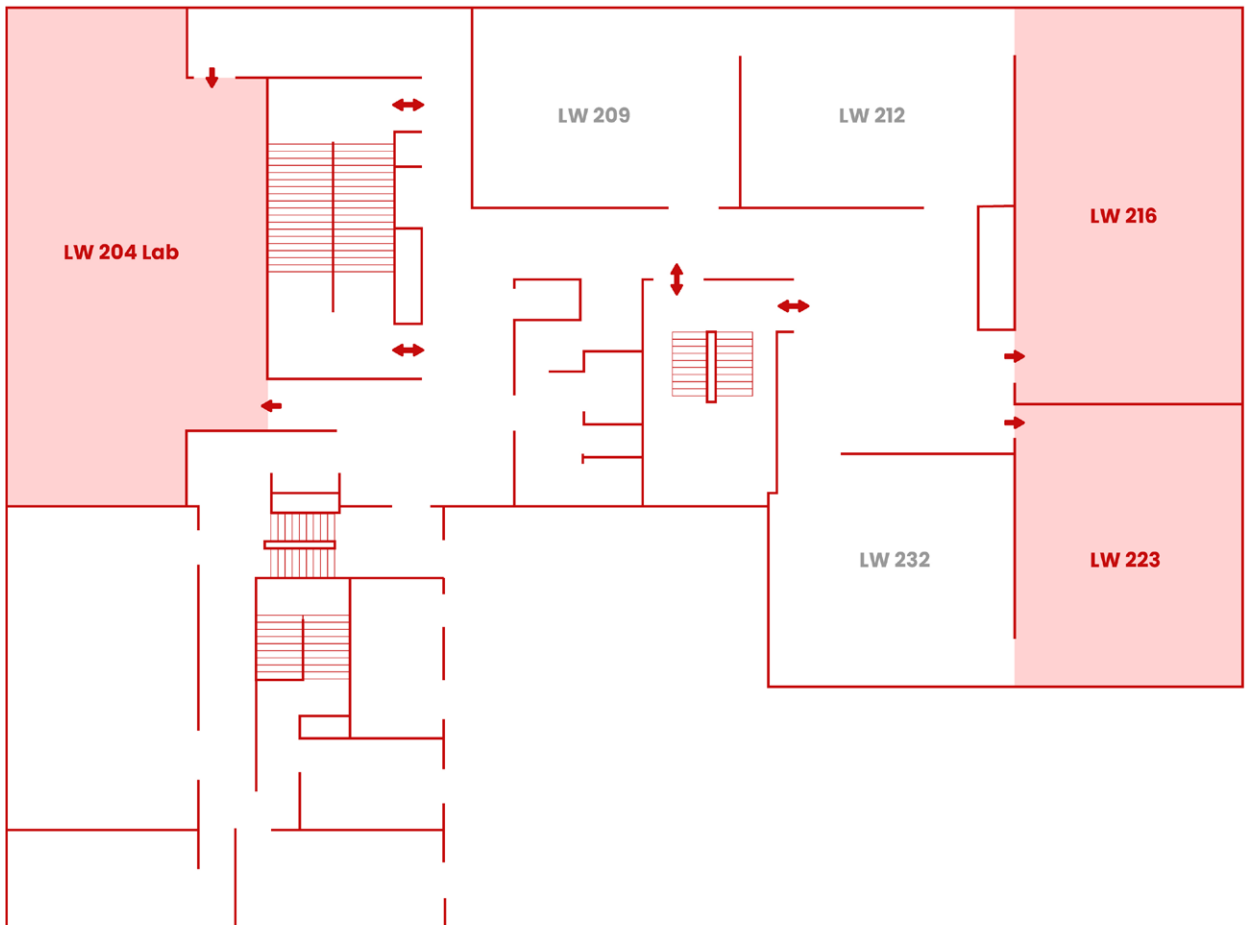
